Baptisms

First Sunday of the month after the Noon Mass. Registration and Catechesis are prerequisites. Please contact the Parish Office.

Marriages

Contact the Parish Office upon engagement; at least six months is needed for preparation of this joyous sacrament!

Reconciliation and First Eucharist

Preparation for children who have attained the age of reason (usually during 2nd grade) is arranged either through the Religious Education Program or St. Rita Elementary School.

Confirmation

A two-year program for freshman/sophomore age teens. Please apply through the Youth Ministry Program.

Communion for the Sick and Homebound

St. Rita Eucharistic Ministers provide Communion home visits. Contact the Parish Office.

Anointing of the Sick and Funeral Liturgies

Please notify us for the Anointing of the Sick, the sacrament intended for the seriously ill or dying which brings Our Lord's special presence and companionship in serious time of need. If someone should die without anointing, remember that the desire to receive is sufficient.

If your loved one has passed, we will assist in making arrangements with your chosen funeral director; refer you to our Bereavement Ministry and Music Ministry; and offer you helpful guidelines that will aid in the selection of readings for a Mass or Memorial Service. We know this can be a tough time and we want you to know that your parish is here for you. Please understand we only have one resident priest; sometimes arrangements for another priest may be needed.



God's Loving Call

Dear Parishioners and Visitors:

In the first reading today Isaiah says: "All you who are thirsty, come to the water. You who have no money, come, receive grain and eat. Come without paying and without cost." Wow! Those are incredible words from the prophet, speaking on behalf of God. God calls us to come. "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).

Each week we have an opportunity to "come" and receive Jesus in the "breaking of the bread" or Eucharistic meal. Although the way this is done right now with COVID-19 is different than usual, this nourishment is essential to our well-being. Our spiritual side thirsts for the eternal God and hungers for the nourishment He brings. Our God invites us to come as we are, with or without money, clean or unclean, simply come and partake in His nourishment. It is love that calls – and as St. Paul says in the second reading today, "nothing can separate us from the love of Christ."

The Gospel miracle of the multiplication of the loaves is a further reminder that God wants to feed and sustain us. Our sustenance is God's very self, as we come to the table of plenty and receive the Body and Blood of Christ. What a gift, what a God! Peace and blessings to you all.

Gospel — All ate until satisfied; they collected twelve baskets of what was left over (*Matthew 14:13-21*).



Come to Me and Eat: Receiving the Sacrament at St. Rita

We are so excited to offer the Sacrament of the Eucharist at St. Rita after the live-stream Mass on Sundays. The Eucharist will be distributed from 11:15 a.m. until noon in the lower parking lot.

Please drive west on Grandview Avenue to enter the parking lot. (This will prevent lines of cars from forming on Baldwin.) Once you reach the lot, monitor volunteers will instruct you on how to proceed. Please wear masks as you approach Fr. Tom and the Eucharistic Minister. They will distribute Communion simultaneously to each side of the car.

Some things to remember:

- Turn off your radio and listen to the peaceful music outside.
- Pull up and put your car in park.
- Center yourself: you are in the presence of the Living God.
- Stretch out your arms and allow the minister to place the Eucharist in your hands.
- After the minister steps away, remove your mask, consume the Eucharist, and sign yourself, *before* driving on. It is perfectly fine to take a moment of prayer; God's time is the best time!

NOTE: We are making this Communion opportunity available, but it is by no means a requirement. Catholics in the Los Angeles Archdiocese are still dispensed from attending Sunday Mass. Each individual's health and safety should be the primary consideration in making the decision to attend any church-sponsored services.
